Dublin

Dublin, the capital city of Ireland, is a charming city with a history dating back to the Viking times. Dublin is one of Europe's most popular city breaks and no matter your reason for visiting our capital, you are guaranteed a "Céad míle fáilte", a thousand welcomes in Irish. From the invasion of the Vikings in the 8th Century through 700 years of Norman occupation, English rule and the formation of the Republic of Ireland in the 1920's, the city of Dublin has had a rich and varied history. Evidence of this can be found in every corner of the city. From a cultural point of view, that means plenty for visitors to see, from historic sites and landmarks to famous monuments and thought-provoking museums.

Some interesting places to visit in Dublin.

Trinity College Dublin

Trinity College is Ireland's oldest university. It was founded by Queen Elizabeth I in 1592. Due to its picturesque setting and the famous people connected with it - Oscar Wilde studied here - Trinity College is one of the city's main tourist attractions. The Trinity library harbours the world's most famous early medieval manuscript, the Book Of Kells. Trinity's campus is located in the centre of Dublin and is spread across an impressive 47 acres.





Dublin Castle

Dublin Castle is situated in the very heart of historic Dublin. For more than 700 years, from 1200 until the formation of the Irish Republic in 1921, it was the centre of the English colonial administration in Ireland. In 930, the Vikings built fortifications at the junction of the River Liffey and its tributary, the now underground River Poddle. The site was called Dubh Linn in Gaelic (pronounced Dub Lin), which means Black Water. Today you can still view the remains of the 13th century structure as part of the guided tour. The present Dublin Castle is used by the Irish Government for state events such as the inauguration of the Irish President and state banquets for visiting dignitaries. Amongst the highlights are the Ladies Drawing Room, the Throne Room and St. Patricks Hall.







Phoenix Park

Just on the outskirts of Dublin City, lies Phoenix Park the biggest enclosed public park of any capital city in Europe. The park was originally created as a royal hunting park in the 1660s and then opened its gates to the public in 1747. A lovely herd of fallow deer still remain in the park to this day. The Phoenix Park is also home to Ireland's national Zoo, Áras an Uachtaráin (the home of our president), and wonderful Victorian flower gardens. It is located only a mile and a half from O'Connell Street in Dublin City. The Glen Pond is set in very scenic surrounds in the Furry Glen. There are many walking tracks and cycle trails available to the public.



A lively and entertaining exhibition on the history and wildlife of the Phoenix Park is on display in the Visitor Centre. Here visitors can receive information and enjoy a historical interpretation of the park from 3500BC to the present day.

Adjoining the Visitor Centre is the fully restored Ashtown Castle, a medieval tower house that probably dates before the 17th century. The castle had been incorporated into an 18th century mansion and was 'rediscovered' when this building was demolished.



St Patrick's Cathedral

Built in honour of Ireland's patron saint, Saint Patrick's Cathedral stands adjacent to the famous well where tradition has it Saint Patrick baptised converts on his visit to Dublin. The parish church of Saint Patrick on this site was granted collegiate status in 1191 and raised to cathedral status in 1224. The present building dates from 1220. The Cathedral is today the National Cathedral of the Church of Ireland (a church of the Anglican communion) and serves as a popular tourist attraction in Ireland. Today the Cathedral is open to all people as an architectural and historical site, but principally as a place of worship.

Supervision of the Event

Management Committee: the LEN Technical Swimming Committee

Jury of Appeal: will be in accordance with LEN Rules and Regulations.

Passport Check: The Head of Delegation must present the passport of each team member before collecting the accreditation cards. The data on accreditation card will be compared to the data on valid passports of all participants and staff members.

Floorplan – Competition pools, will be published in the next information bulletin.

Anti- Doping

During the Championship anti-doping protocols will be conducted. All competitors participating in the event may be required to be tested for doping control.

Insurance

The insurance of the participants is the responsibility of the respective federations. Insurance must also ensure that it is valid in the case of a Covid-19 infection.

Arrival and Transport

The Organising Committee will facilitate airport welcome and transportation services for the duration of the event. Transportation services provided will be between the airport, the official team hotels and the competition venue. Requests for travel must be made by completing the online form which can be found below.

Online Arrival and Travel form.

During the training and competition period, transport (bus service) between the pool and the official hotels will be organised for the event. It is mandatory that only the buses provided by the LOC are used and not public transport or others.







Entry Conditions

The Championships shall be open to all LEN Federations. For the 2023 LEN European U23 Swimming Championships, LEN reserves the right to invite other members of World Aquatics to participate in these Championships, hereinafter referred to as "Non-LEN Federations". All competitors shall be aged between 19 and 23 years by 31 December in the year of competition with the minimum age category being 19 years. In addition, a competitor who has achieved an "A" qualifying time for the World Aquatics Championships 2023 shall compete in that event in Fukuoka 2023 to be eligible to compete in the equivalent event in Dublin. For the avoidance of doubt, i) if a swimmer has achieved an "A" qualification time for Fukuoka 2023 but is not part of his / her national team traveling to Japan, or ii) has not achieved an "A" qualifying time for Fukuoka 2023, he / she may still compete in Dublin, as long as he / she meets the age criterion.

Exceptionally for the 2023 Championships a Federation may enter a maximum of one competitor per event in the age category 14-18 years (born 2005-2009) as part of its four competitors per event (see U23-SW2.3 below).

U23-SW 2.2 Events are (men and women):

- a) Freestyle 50 m, 100 m, 200 m, 400 m, 800 m, 1500 m; b) Breaststroke 50 m, 100 m, 200 m;
- c) Backstroke 50 m, 100 m, 200 m;

- d) Butterfly 50 m, 100 m, 200 m;
- e) Individual Medley 200 m, 400 m;
- f) Relay events may be included in the Competition Programme at the discretion of the LEN TSC
- g) Skins races may be included in the Competition Programme at the discretion of the LEN TSC.

U23-SW 2.3 In individual events a maximum of four (4) entries per Federation and per event may be submitted. Notwithstanding times and places achieved in the heats, only the two (2) fastest swimmers of each Federation may: a) proceed to the finals; b) take part in a swim off; c) be nominated as a reserve. In any event where heats are not held a maximum of two (2) swimmers per Federation may take part in finals. A maximum of two swimmers from Non-LEN Federations may proceed to compete in the final.

U23-SW 2.4 In relay events entries for one (1) team per Federation and per event may be submitted. All swimmers entered for the Championships may swim in relays.

U23-SW 2.5 The order of the events will be circulated by the LEN Office






Accommodation
